
Piedmont Regional Adult and Continuing Education Programs provide free GED classes for all five GED tests (writing, science, social studies, reading and math); **registration is required.**

ATTENTION ALL GENEALOGY RESEARCHERS

Ancestry has added new Virginia vital records databases to its collection!

You may access the databases through the Fauquier County Public Library's Ancestry Library subscription, available at any branch library. Virginia births, marriages, divorces and deaths are included in these vital records. Several years of records are covered in each database, however some years include an image of the certificate, while others are an index to the record information. 
