

BUDGET VOTE

Tuesday, September 30 is the date of the library budget vote. A taxpayer whose home is assessed at the Southold Town average of \$6000 will pay \$204.28 in library support in 2015. The total tax levy increase is 1.46%, bringing the operating budget to \$877,697. With debt service, the total budget is \$1,010,999 and the total tax levy in the two school districts is \$990,958. The tax rate for both districts is \$34.046 for each thousand dollars of assessed value. The vote is held in the library meeting room for both school districts from 2 pm to 8 pm. All voters who are registered in Greenport, East Marion and Orient are eligible library district voters.


