

BUDGET VOTE

If you are a registered voter in the Greenport or Oysterponds School Districts, you are eligible to vote in the **LIBRARY BUDGET VOTE** on **TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29th** from 2-8 pm at the library.

This year's tax levy increase of \$37,382 exceeds the .076% tax cap by \$29,851. In the past several years we have done all that we could to stay within or below the Governor's limits, reducing staff, limiting or freezing salary increases and finding ways to cooperate with other agencies to keep costs down. Health care costs, materials prices, increased use of digital resources and the accompanying increase in those costs are all conspiring to push our operating costs beyond that limit. The difference per homeowner is about \$6 per year – less than the cost of one slice of pizza and a soda.

There will be an information session on Monday, September 14th at 6pm. Bring your questions, or stop in the library at any time to take a look at the budget and ask questions of the library Director.

Please make time to vote on the 29th or obtain an absentee ballot from your School District Clerk.
