Q. How much does it cost to attend programs?

A. Library programs are free and open to the public.

Q. What level are your computer classes?

A. The classes are geared toward new users who have basic knowledge of using the keyboard and mouse. Anyone having issues with their electronic devices may come to the Drop-In Tech Help sessions.

Q. What are the age levels of youth programs?

A. Babytime is for ages birth to walkers, and Toddlertime is for walkers to age 3. Storytimes are for preschoolers ages 3-5, but younger siblings are welcome to attend. Teen programs are for ages 11 and older. DIY @ Rolling Hills programs are geared for third graders and older.


