

## KIDS' FINES ARE ONLY 13%



At 13% of our fine revenue, kids' fines are 0.35% of our budget.

Libraries have sought grant support, raised adult fines, or have just eaten the cost.



#### READING OFF YOUR FINES

Kids read for a period of time and get a set amount of fine waived. In NYC, 15 minutes of reading removed \$1 of fines.

Fine relief is also offered for program participation, use of e-resources, and art, crafts, music or other creative pursuits.



### **RESULTS COAST TO COAST**



Libraries report increases in active patrons and in circulation once a fine relief program is implemented.

Fine relief programs also appear to generate positive goodwill among parents and children alike.
